Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc. to check for quality.

On the day of the show, all exhibits must be put in position between **8.00am** and **10.30am**. No exhibits to be removed until 4.00pm.

The decision of the judges is absolutely final.

1st - £1, 2nd - 50p, 3rd - 25p

POINTS in all classes will be:

1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point
