On the day of the show, all exhibits must be put in position between **8.00am** and **10.00am**. No exhibits to be removed until 4.00pm.

The decision of the judges is absolutely final. The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

All vegetables to be washed and free of dust. Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 3" (7.5cm). Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces. Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc. to check for quality.
