7.00pm and 8.00pm on Tuesday 30th July.**

No exhibitor may enter more than **3 entries per class.**

On the day of the show, all exhibits must be put in position between
8.00am and **10.00am**. No exhibits to be removed until 4.00pm.

The decision of the judges is absolutely final.

The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

PRIZES in all classes will be:

1st - £1.50p 2nd - £1 3rd - 50p

POINTS in all classes will be:

1st - 3 points 2nd - 2 points 3rd - 1 point

SCHEDULE

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES

All vegetables to be washed and free of dust.

Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 3" (7.5cm).

Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces.

Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc. to check for quality.
